

## Rules for the reading program:

Certificates are awarded for each of the four levels completed:

- 1) MEMBERS - 20 Books
- 2) STAR - 45 Books
- 3) TORCH - 75 Books
- 4) CENTURY - 100 Books

After reading the prescribed number of books at each level, from the chosen categories or Free Choice, a review of a minimum of 50 words must be written for each book and sent to the NJSFWC ESO Chairman.
