### State Overview

The New Jersey State Federation of Women's Club of GFWC (NJSFWC) was founded in 1894 and currently has 175 clubs and 7,000 members throughout the state and unified in the goal to make a difference in the lives of others; one project at a time.

### NJSFWC accomplishments

- Spearheaded the preservation of the Palisades on the Hudson
- Founded New Jersey College for Women in 1918 (Douglass Residential College at Rutgers University)
- Annual Woman of Achievement Award recognizing women leaders
- Recognized by the New Jersey Library Association for the establishment of numerous libraries (donated over 43,000 books)
- Special state-wide projects benefiting communities such as Community Food Bank, Domestic Violence Awareness and Prevention, Autism NJ, Gilda's Club/The Wellness Community, Prevent Child Abuse NJ, and Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), NJ.
