

RESOLUTIONS TO BE RECINDED

ANIMALS INCLUDED IN DOMESTIC VIOLENCE RETRAINING ORDERS

Reason: Signed into law on January, 2012

BREAST AND OVARIAN CANCER RESPONSE TASK FORCE – NEW JERSEY

Reason: Task Force was signed as an Executive Order in 2000

CIVIL RAPE SHIELD LAW

Reason: Signed into law in January 2019

DECENCY IN BROADCASTING

Reason: Became public law No. 109-235 on June 15, 2006

DIGITAL IMPERSONATION PREVENTION ACT

Reason: Became law and updated on August 6, 2021

ELDER ABUSE COVERED UNDER DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Reason: Elder Abuse is covered in **The Prevention of Domestic Violence Act of 1991**

IGNITION INTERLOCK DEVICES

Reason: Ignition Interlock devices and their installment was covered in a series of laws in 2018 and included the intention of the original resolution

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN

Reason: In May of 2004 The High Technology Crimes Unit was renamed the Digital Technology Investigations Unit and dedicated to child exploitation on the internet.

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST ACT OF 2013

Reason: Grants are now offered in all 50 states

NATIONAL HEALTH LITERACY ACT

Reason: The Health Care Act has addressed this issue and the CDC has created a health literacy branch

NATIONAL HOUSING TRUST FUND

Reason: In 2016 and 2021, the National Housing Trust Fund was included in the national budgets and included the intention of the original resolution.

NATIONAL SUICIDE HOTLINE DESIGNATION ACT

Reason: Signed into law on December 12, 2019

NEWBORN SCREENING PROGRAM

Reason: All the diseases listed in the resolution are now included in newborn testing

NEW JERSEY ADULTS WITH AUTISM TASK FORCE

Reason: Signed into law and Task Force goals were met and recommendations given to the legislature.

NEW JERSEY BAN ON SINGLE USE DISPOSABLES

Reason: Signed into law in 2021

NEW JERSEY FIRE AND EMS CRISIS INTERVENTION SERVICES

Reason: The New Jersey Crisis Intervention Response Network (NJCIRN) includes active and retired police, fire and rescue personnel who act as trained peer support counselors and coverage includes the entire state.

OMBUDSMAN FOR ABUSED AND NEGLECTED CHILDREN

Reason: Signed into law in January 2018

OPEN SPACE PRESERVATION-STABLE STATE FUNDING

Reason: Signed into law in 1999, the “Garden State Preservation Trust Act” (N.J.S.A. 13:8C-1 et seq.)

OSTEOPOROSIS PREVENTION AND TREATMENT PROGRAM

Reason The New Jersey Interagency Council on Osteoporosis (ICO) is a multidisciplinary coalition comprised of members of the public; state government; and healthcare, academic and corporate communities which submitted a strategic plan that covers the intention of the original resolution

PACKAGING REDUCTION ACT

Reason: Signed into law on Nov. 4, 2020

PEGGY'S LAW

Reason: Signed into law on August 7, 2017

PERMIT THE THIRTEEN FOLD RECITAL AT NATIONAL CEMENTERIES

Reason: Intention of the original resolution was clarified by the Department of Veterans Affairs

PROSECUTION OF HATE CRIMES

Reason: Signed into law in 2009

PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO INSTRUCT ON SAFE HAVENS

Reason: Signed into law in August, 2000

REQUIRE 911 DIRECT DIAL

Reason: Signed into law in both NJ and on National level

RESTORATIVE AND TRANSFORMATIVE JUSTICE FOR YOUTHS AND COMMUNITY PILOT PROGRAM

Reason: Became law in 2021 and will be piloted in 4 NJ communities: Camden, Newark, Paterson and Trenton

SEXUAL VIOLENCE TRAINING FOR NEW JERSEY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, PROSECUTORS AND JUDGES

Reason: Series of laws were signed in 2019 and in 2021 and provides training for law enforcement officers, prosecutors and judges

SICKLE CELL ANEMIA- PRESCRIPTION DRUG BENEFITS

Reason: Signed into law in 2019

STOP COUNTERFEIT DRUGS BY REGULATING AND ENHANCING ENFORCEMENT ACT (SCREEN ACT)

Reason: Signed into law in 2020

STRONG FAMILIES ACT OF 2017

Reason: Funding was extended and continued through 2020

SUPPORTING REAUTHORIZATION OF CASA FUNDING

Reason: Governor's FY22 Budget Proposal sustains CASA's appropriation at \$2.5 million

SUSTAINABLE STATE FUNDING FOR PRESERVATION AND STEWARDSHIP OF OPEN SPACE, PARKS, FARMLAND AND HISTORIC SITES IN NEW JERSEY

Reason: In 2014, voters approved a constitutional amendment dedicating a portion of the corporate business tax to pay for environmental programs. The measure dedicated four percent to six percent of the tax revenue beginning in July 2019. The measure is expected to dedicate more than \$2.15 billion over the next 20 years for the conservation programs listed in the original resolution

TARA'S LAW: PROTECTION OF INDIVIDUALS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES WHO RESIDE IN COMMUNITY CARE RESIDENCES

Reason: Signed into Law on December 6, 2012

TASK FORCE ON IMPROVING SPECIAL EDUCATION FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS

Reason: Was established by the Legislature and met between 2014 and 2015. The report presented 27 recommendations

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS BY TAXPAYERS TO THE COMMUNITY FOOD BANK FUND

Signed into law in 2010
