# BENEFITS OF BELONGING

#### **GFWC AWARDS**

State Federations, clubs, and individual members who pay per capita dues are eligible to compete for awards, participate in contests, and apply for grants. Complete details for each GFWC Award are listed in the GFWC Club Manual, where you can also find contest rules, tips for winning entries, and judging criteria.

## **GFWC Jennie Award**

The GFWC Jennie Award is named in honor of GFWC's founder, Jane Cunningham Croly, who wrote for national newspapers under the pseudonym "Jennie June." The award is an occasion to highlight extraordinary clubwomen who epitomize Jennie's spirit of independence, courage, and persistence through their roles as volunteers within their clubs, representatives of their community, and as members of a family or extended family. Club members are nominated by their clubs to compete at state, regional, and national levels for the Federation's highest individual honor.

## **Community Impact Program Award**

The GFWC Community Impact Program Award offers GFWC clubs financial incentive to implement projects designed to impact a specific problem in their community. This award provides a vision for the future of the relationship between clubs and their communities.

# **Membership Grants**

GFWC grants are available to clubs to assist with recruitment efforts and to Districts to assist with club-building efforts. Designated for each GFWC fiscal year, which begins July 1 and ends June 30, GFWC offers \$50 to clubs for member recruitment programs and \$100 to Districts for club-building programs. GFWC awards only one grant per club or District per GFWC fiscal year.

#### **GFWC LEGISLATIVE ACTION CENTER**

The GFWC Legislative Action Center is a powerful tool for GFWC's public issues and advocacy efforts. This tool can be used to track bills, contact your local representatives, and take action on issues relevant to GFWC Resolutions.
