#### **Thomas Edison National Historical Park**

Edison's laboratory was the birthplace of many groundbreaking inventions, including the motion picture camera, improved phonographs, sound recordings, silent and sound movies, and the nickel-iron alkaline electric storage battery. With over half of Edison's 1,093 patents originating from this very lab, a visit here offers a fascinating glimpse into his genius and innovation.
